## 1 Package description

Add `\usepackage{DASgenerator}` to the preamble of your `.tex` file and use one of the commands below at the location where you would like your data access statement to appear. Note that DOIs are formatted using `\url` to permit non-hyphenated linebreaks.

### 1.1 For papers without any data or where data are provided within the text or as a supplement

- Use `\NoData` if your study has no underlying data
- Use `\Review` if your paper is a review of existing literature and no new data were generated
- Use `\DataInPaper` if sufficient data to support your conclusions are included in the text of your paper
- Use `\DataInSupplement` if sufficient data to support your conclusions are included as a supplement to your paper

### 1.2 For papers with data published in data.bris

In `data.bris`, datasets can be published with one of the following access arrangements depending on the nature and sensitivity of the data. Please choose the appropriate statement for your data below and use the corresponding command.

- "I want my data to be freely available for download on `data.bris`." – use `\DataBrisOpen{#1}` where `#1` is the DOI you have been assigned by `data.bris`.
- "I want my data record to be visible on `data.bris`, but bona fide researchers should register and sign an access agreement before being able to download the actual data." – use `\DataBrisRestrict{#1}` where `#1` is the DOI you have been assigned by `data.bris`.

- "I want my data record to be visible on data.bris, but requests for access should be approved by the University's Data Access Committee." – use `\DataBrisControl{#1}` where #1 is the DOI you have been assigned by data.bris.

## 2 Examples

Has no data	"This study did not involve any underlying data."
Is a review article	"This study did not generate any new data."
Has supporting data in paper	"Supporting data are provided within this paper."
Has supporting data in supplement	"Supporting data are provided as supplementary information accompanying this paper."
Has supporting data published openly in data.bris	"Supporting data are openly available from data.bris under the DOI: 10.5523/bris.fauxdoi1234567."
Has supporting data published in data.bris with restricted access	"Supporting data will made available to bona fide researchers subject to a data access agreement. Details of how to request access are available at the University of Bristol's data repository under the DOI: 10.5523/bris.fauxdoi1234567."
Has supporting data published in data.bris with stricter controlled access	"Supporting data can only be made available to bona fide researchers subject to a data access agreement and following approval from the University of Bristol Data Access Committee. Details of how to request access are available at the University of Bristol's data repository under the DOI: 10.5523/bris.fauxdoi1234567."
